GOSPEL REFLECTION- FOSTERING LOVE THROUGH SHARING (Jn 6.1-15)

Mother Teresa of Calcutta once related a touching story of a poor Hindu family in Calcutta she visited. The wretched family had been starving for many days. Mother Teresa visited them and brought a big parcel of rice to the mother. She was surprised to see how the mother divided the rice into two equal portions and went out with one bundle to give it to her Moslem neighbour. When she returned, Mother Teresa asked her why she had



done such a generous deed. The woman replied: "My family can manage with half the rice in this bag. My neighbour's family has several children and they are also starving." On this 17th Sunday of the year B, the readings invite us to become humble instruments in God's hands by sharing our blessings and resources with our needy brothers and sisters. The **first reading** tells us how the prophet Elisha, by invoking God's power, fed one hundred men with twenty barley loaves out of compassion and generosity. Thus, fulfilling his prophecy: "They will eat and have left over." Today's **Responsorial Psalm** tells us that it is "the hand of the Lord that feeds us," and that it is God who "answers all our needs." **In the second reading**, St. Paul reminds us to be a community and family united by one faith, one baptism and one spirit. He admonished us to cultivate the virtues of Charity, generosity, gentility, complete selflessness, and patience towards one another. Moved by compassion for his flock in **today's gospel**, Jesus replicated the miracle of Elisha by feeding more than five thousand people with five loaves of bread and two fish. He was sensitive to their situation and need. Christ cares both for our physical and spiritual needs. He feeds us with both His word, and the Holy

Eucharist. We need more people with loaves of bread and fish; the world is in dire need of more men from Baal-Shahanshah and the boy with five loaves of bread and two fish to share the resources of the world, mainly by feeding the hungry. Let us remember that, we shall be chiefly judged based on our generosity and kindness to other. Jesus will definitely ask us, how many people did we give something to eat? How many people did we use our opportunities to assist? (Mtt. 25:14-31) Go today and share with others. There is love in sharing.

CATECHISM: THE HOLY MASS EXPLAINED

FAITH MATTERS: A Catholic, who says that he/she loves Christ would not fail to love the Mass. To love the Mass does not mean just being present and nothing more; it means to be present with faith and devotion and to



take part actively in the Mass realizing that it is the Sacrifice of the Cross being renewed on the altar. Participation in the Mass involves basically our faith. Without faith, all that one would see on the altar is just bread and wine; just gestures, symbols, and nothing more. It is only through faith, we acknowledge that at the consecration of the bread and wine, they are changed into the body and blood of Jesus Christ. If one would come for Mass without faith, the person would easily feel bored or get distracted. Without faith, one would fail to understand what Christ's death on the Cross would mean for us. Hence Faith is the most required disposition when we come to participate in the Mass.

First reading

2 Kings 4:42-44

They will eat, and have some left over

A man came from Baal-shalishah, bringing Elisha, the man of God, bread from the firstfruits, twenty barley loaves and fresh grain in the ear.' 'Give it to the people to eat,' Elisha said. But his servant replied, 'How can I serve this to a hundred men?' 'Give it to the people to eat' he insisted 'for the Lord says this, "They will eat and have some left over."' He served them; they ate and had some left over, as the Lord had said.

Responsorial Psalm 144(145):10-11,15-18 You open wide your hand, O Lord, And grant our desires.

Second reading Ephesians 4:1-6 One Body, one Spirit, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God

I, the prisoner in the Lord, implore you to lead a life worthy of your vocation. Bear with one another charitably, in complete selflessness, gentleness and patience. Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you together. There is one Body, one Spirit, just as you were all called into one and the same hope when you were called. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God who is Father of all, over all, through all and within all.

Gospel

The feeding of the five thousand

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough, he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.
