GAUDETE SUNDAY: THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT:

The central theme of today's readings is the command "Rejoice!" We are to do so mainly by realizing the presence of Jesus in our midst, by receiving Jesus into our lives through our repentance, by our



renewal of life, and by our faithful doing of God's will. Today is called "Gaudete" Sunday because today's Mass begins with the opening antiphon, "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). Today we light the rose-colored candle of the Advent wreath, and the priest may wear rosecoloured vestments, to express our communal joy in the coming of Jesus as our Saviour. In the Gospel, (Luke 3:10-18); the people asked, what should we do in preparation for the coming of the Messiah? John answered; "Repent and reform your lives," and prayerfully wait for the Messiah.

Suggestions: Regular monthly Confession makes us strong and enables us to receive more grace in the Eucharist. Let us read the Bible and pray the Rosary daily. We might also fast once a month or week. Let us have the courage of our Christian convictions to turn off TV programs that include explicit sexual behavior, violence and the use of foul language. Let us spend some time every week in adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Let us forgive those who offend us and pray for them. Finally, let us share our love with others as selfless and humble service. "Do small things but with great love" (St. Teresa of Calcutta, "Mother Teresa").

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION (FHC) 2025 GROUP. St Paul's and St Finbarr's.

The First Holy Communion (FHC) preparation program 2025 commences on SATURDAY 4th January, at 9.30am, St Paul's Church Hall, and on SUNDAY 5th January 9.30am, at St Finbarr's Church.

This is the first of the weekly preparation classes and will continue on each successive Saturdays at St Paul's and Sundays at St Finbarr's until June 2025, with the exception of half and end of term school holidays. The move to Sunday mornings before Mass from Saturday mornings at St Finbarr's is new in order to facilitate greater attendance. Both at St Paul's and St Finbarr's every child MUST attend each of the FHC sessions and STAY with their parent throughout. First readingZephaniah 3:14-18a'The Lord will exult over you with loud
singing.'Sing aloud, O daughter of Sion;
shout, O Israel!Rejoice and exult with all your heart,
O daughter of Jerusalem!The Lord has taken away the judgements
against you;
he has cleared away your enemies.

The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall never again fear evil. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: 'Fear not, O Sion; let not your hands grow weak. The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing. I will gather those of you who mourn for the festival, so that you will no longer suffer reproach.'

Responsorial Psalm Is 12:2-3. 4b-d. 5-6. R3 Shout aloud and sing praise, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

Gospel

Luke 3:10-18

'And we, what shall we do?'

At that time: The crowds asked John, 'What, then, shall we do?' And he answered them, 'Whoever has two tunics is to share with him who has none, and whoever has food is to do likewise.' Tax collectors also came to be baptised and said to him, 'Teacher, what shall we do?' And he said to them, 'Collect no more than you are authorized to do.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what shall we do?' And he said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or by false accusation, and be content with your wages.'

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, John answered them all, saying, 'I baptise you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people.

Act of Spiritual Communion
