

GENERAL HEALING AND ANOINTING OF THE SICK TODAY SUNDAY 3PM ST PAUL'S (EXPOSITION/ADORATION STARTS BY 2:30)

GOSPEL REFLECTION: GOD CALLS EACH ONE OF US FOR A PURPOSE (Lk.5:1-11)

Every Christian by virtue of baptism has a special call from God to carry out a specific mission. Just as each one of us is unique, so is our mission. We have both individual and collective missions. God does not look at the



external features of a person or is He concerned about the qualification or skill. Without favouritism or prejudice, God extends His call equally to everyone. His criteria seem to be His trust that you can do it because He provides whatever is needed to accomplish the mission. The God who called Isaiah, Paul, Peter and the likes, continues to call people even in our time. Like Isaiah, Paul and Peter, we are called to transit from a state of sin-full-ness to a state of sin-less-ness. We are called like them to drop the attractions of our past and embrace the new things God is doing for us (Isaiah 43:18-19). Like Isaiah, our lips need divine touch, like Paul our eyes

need to be reopened to a new reality and we need a new name, like Peter we need to follow Jesus Christ unto a new way of life. Each of us is being asked to search beyond our own fears today and to fish people for God. This call may come in different forms; Let us confidently say like Isaiah: "Here I am, Lord send me, "and Christ will make us "fishers of men." May we reflect on these questions; Where am I called to go, who am I called to be, and what am I called to do?

CATECHISM ON THE ANNOINTING OF THE SICK

This sacred anointing of the sick was instituted by Christ our Lord as a true and proper sacrament of the New Testament. "Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them



with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven". (James 5:14-15) The Catholic Church does not believe that the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick replaces the need for medical care, instead, it recognises that, at times, suffering through sickness can have a purpose. Through the Sacrament of anointing of the sick, the Lord blesses us with spiritual comfort, forgiveness of sin, strength and courage to accept illness and relief from anxiety.

The special grace of the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has as its effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ ... the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner, the sufferings of illness or old age and led to the forgiveness of sins. If the sick person was not able to obtain the physical restoration of health; his or her soul is prepared for salvation and made ready for passing over to eternal life. (Catechism of the Catholic Church- CCC 1532)

The apostles continued the ministry of healing, anointing people with oil and reconciling them to the Lord. We see this in their ministry throughout the scriptures. In the Gospel it says; "They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many that were sick and healed them. (Mark 6:13). May the Lord grant us healing and peace as we embrace His mercy through the sacraments. Amen.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY 9TH FEBRUARY 2025

First reading Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

'Here I am! Send me.'

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the Temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings. And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory! And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!' Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth and said: 'Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for.' And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' Then I said, 'Here I am! Send me.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 138(137):1-2a. 2bc, 3. 4-5. 7c-8. R1c In the presence of the angels I praise you, O Lord.

1. I thank you, Lord, with all my heart; you have heard the words of my mouth. In the presence of the angels I praise you. I bow down towards your holy Temple.

On the day I called, you answered me; you increased the strength of my soul.

4.With your right hand you save me; the Lord will accomplish this for me.

O Lord, your merciful love is eternal; discard not the work of your hands.

Second reading 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

'So we preach and so you believed.'

I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you — unless you believed in vain.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers

and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the Apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the Apostles, unworthy to be called an Apostle, because I persecuted the Church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace towards me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

Gospel Acclamation Matthew 4:19 Alleluia, alleluia. Follow me, says the Lord, and I will make you fishers of men. Alleluia.

Gospel Luke 5:1-11

'They left everything and followed him. At that time: The crowd was pressing in on Jesus to hear the word of God. He was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch.' And Simon answered, 'Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets.' And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. They signalled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord.' For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men.' And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
