GOSPEL REFLECTION: A CALL FOR TRANSFORMATION (LK 9:28-36) Jesus in today's gospel revealed his



future glory to Peter, James and John during his transfiguration on the mountain. They saw the glory and splendour of God revealed in Christ who represents the New Covenant; in Moses, who represents the Law; and in Elijah who represents the Prophets. The primary purpose of Jesus' Transfiguration was to allow him to consult his Heavenly Father in order to ascertain His plan for His Son's suffering, death and Resurrection. The secondary aim was to make Jesus' chosen disciples aware of his Divine glory so that they might discard their worldly ambitions and dreams of a conquering political Messiah and might be strengthened in their time of trial. The Transfiguration established Jesus' glorious identity as the beloved Son of God. Just as Jesus' Transfiguration strengthened the apostles in their time of trial, each holy Mass should be our source of Heavenly strength against temptations, and our Lenten renewal. Beloved in Christ, Jesus' transfiguration offers us a message of encouragement and hope in moments of doubt and during our dark moments of despair and hopelessness. We need "mountain-top experiences" in our lives like Peter, James, and John when we spend extra time in prayer and fasting during Lent. May the crosses of our daily

lives and our Holy Communion with the living Jesus be the source of our daily "transfiguration," transforming our minds and hearts so that we may do better by humble and selfless service to others, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

PLEASE PRAY FOR Jane Francis from St Paul's who passed away suddenly last Monday. Jane was a lifelong parishioner of St Paul's. As a child she attended St Ursula's Convent School in Dover. CATECHISM-THE SEASON OF LENT:

Lent is the period of six weeks (40 days not including Sundays). It is the time before Easter during which the faithful abstain and



fast in remembrance of the ultimate sacrifice Jesus made on Calvary. Lent starts on **Ash Wednesday** and the last week of Lent is called **Holy Week**. Jesus went into the desert to fast and pray before beginning his work for God. Jesus was tempted several times by Satan but was able to resist the temptation. Lent allows Christians to remember Jesus's prayer and fasting in the desert. It is a time of giving things up and a test of self-discipline. It is a time of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. It is a time of Reflection, Repentance, and Reconciliation. **Fasting and Abstinence during Lent:** There are two main ways that Catholics use to focus on growing closer to God during the Lenten season:

abstinence and fasting. **ABSTINENCE:** This is the act of "doing without" or avoiding something. **FASTING:** Fasting is the act of doing with less. In the Catholic Church, those ages **18 - 59** must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (**Canon 97**). The time of Lent, through fasting and abstaining, may be an important reminder of what it means to suffer. This small suffering should not be met with misery but with great joy as we better understand the incredible sacrifice that Jesus Christ made for humanity.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY 16TH MARCH 2025

First reading

Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God enters into a covenant with Abram, the man of faith.

In those days: God brought Abram outside and said, 'Look towards heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your offspring be.' And he believed the Lord, and he counted it to him as righteousness.

And he said to him, 'I am the Lord who brought you out from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' And he brought him all these, cut them in half, and laid each half over against the other. But he did not cut the birds in half. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell on Abram. And behold, dreadful and great darkness fell upon him. When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking firepot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. Luke 9:28b-36

'As Jesus was praying, the appearance of his face was altered.'

At that time: Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray. And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were talking with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, but when they became fully awake they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah' — not knowing what he said. As he was saying these things, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!' And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen.
