

GOSPEL REFLECTION: THE SPECK IN YOUR BROTHER'S EYE: (LK 6:39-45)



One of the problems of our generation is the rate at which we are pre-occupied, fixated and focused on the faults of other people rather than ourselves. We forget that we have our journey and people we meet also have their own journey; we spend hours and loads of time seeking to know some negative stories or news about other people. Jesus draws our attention to practical points of Christian living and challenges us to use words as he used them in his preaching and healing ministry: to heal, restore and bring back life, joy, and hope. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus condemns our careless, malicious and rash judgments about the behaviour, feelings, motives, or actions of others by using the examples of one blind man leading another blind man and one man with a log stuck in his eye, trying to remove a tiny

speck from another's eye. Jesus does not mean that we should not correct immoral behaviour and sexual misbehaviour or stop admonishing children and students as parents and teachers, or, worse, should promote moral relativism. In both Matthew and Luke, the statements that follow the prohibition on judging indicate that it is an elaboration of the Golden Rule—the idea that we should treat others the way that we, ourselves, want to be treated. We must avoid gossiping about, and passing rash, thoughtless and pain-inflicting judgments on others, damaging their good reputation and causing irreparable harm. We should leave all judgment to God, practice mercy and forgiveness, and pray for God's grace to get rid of all forms of hypocrisy in our own lives. Lord, help us to look more on the inside, seeking ways to love you above all things. Amen.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY 2ND MARCH 2025

First reading

Sirach 27:4-7

'Do not praise a man before you hear him reason.'

When a sieve is shaken, the refuse appears; so a person's filth in his thoughts. The kiln tests the potter's vessels; likewise, the test of a person is in his reasoning. The fruit discloses the cultivation of a tree; so, the expression of a thought discloses the cultivation of a person's mind.

Do not praise a man before you hear him reason, for this is the test of people.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 92(91):2-3. 13-14. 15-16. R cf. 2a It is good to give thanks to you, O Lord.

It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to make music to your name, O Most High, to proclaim your loving mercy in the morning, and your truth in the watches of the night.

The just one will flourish like the palm tree, and grow like a Lebanon cedar. Planted in the house of the Lord, they will flourish in the courts of our God. *It is good to give thanks to you, O Lord.*

1 Corinthians 15:54-58
'He gives us the victory through Jesus Christ.'

Brothers and Sisters: When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: 'Death is swallowed up in victory.' 'O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?'

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labour is not in vain.

Luke 6:39-45

'Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks.'

At that time: Jesus told his disciples a parable: 'Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit? A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher. Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the speck that is in your eye", when you yourself do not see the log that is in your own eye? You hypocrite! First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take out the speck that is in your brother's eye.

'For no good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit, for each tree is known by its own fruit. For figs are not gathered from thorn bushes, nor are grapes picked from a bramble bush. The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.'

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.
